Tract one was bordered by Lisburn Road. Abernathy and wife Sarah granted acres to Adam Barnhart on 16 June Adam and Martin Wise were also taxed no land. Adam Wise was also taxed no land. The adjacent listing not alphabetical was for John Wise Junr, renter. The land was adjacent to land of Peter Bricker. Jacob Wise Jr was adjacent to David Rowan. Died - Last week after a long and painful sickness, Mrs. Weiss, wife of Mr. Jacob Weiss, of Middleton township. Jacob Jr was taxed for acres, perhaps the acres taxed in Jacob Wise, blacksmith was also taxed. George and Frederick Wise were taxed as freemen. Jacob Jr was also taxed. That I have applied to the honorable the judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Cumberland County, for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this State, who have appointed the 14th day of February next to hear me and my creditors at the Court House in the borough in Carlisle, when and where they may attend if they see fit. It is a challenge to distinguish Jacob born and Jacob born of Middleton and Jacob born of Allen in some land records and documents. There may be other people named Jacob Wise in the area. It is plausible that I have confused some of the notes of these persons and I would appreciate any corrections or further information. The genealogy given here of four generations of this Wise family is substantially based on two documents: Michael Ridner perhaps Michael Ritner, born c , Wm. The grandsons named in that will are assumed here to be the oldest sons, John Jacob born and Frederick, of this Jacob born , the other grandsons perhaps not being of age when the will was written. This abstraction appears to be in error. The record appears, instead, to list the birth of Jacob Weiss on 13 September , sponsored by Elteren parents. The name Anna Margareta was related to the prior birth. Maria C Wise age 55 , was listed nearby with George age 22 and Amanda age Maria Wise, age 64 , was listed nearby.

Judges also decide cases involving adoption, divorce, child custody, abuse, juvenile delinquency, estates, guardianships, charitable organizations and many other matters. The Common Pleas courts are organized into 60 judicial districts. Lancaster County has its own judicial district. Judges of the Common Pleas courts are elected to year terms. A president judge and a court administrator serve in each judicial district. The Clerk signs and affixes the Seal of the Courts to all writs and processes, administers oaths and affirmations, and assumes custody of the seal and records of the Courts. The Clerk certifies and distributes orders of the Court. The Clerk also certifies and prepares bills of costs for the defendants and utilizes the computerized financial management system to disburse fines, costs and restitution. Prothonotary The office of the Prothonotary is the custodian of all civil matters in the county. This includes naturalization, immigration, equity actions, judgements, federal and local tax liens, city liens, family court, arbitrations, license suspension appeals, appeals to higher court, commercial code filings, applications for passports and divorce proceedings.
