If it helps you, then great! Drape the scarf around your shoulders with the large point hanging in front of you. Wrap the long ends around your neck and pull around and down, tucking under the large point. Drape around your shoulders and tie the two ends in a small knot behind your back. Slide the majority of the scarf off to one side of your outstretched arms. Wrap the larger section around your body and over your opposite shoulder. The larger section should secure the smaller section. Drape the scarf over your shoulders from your front to your back. Tug the scarf down so it is tight up to your neck. Wrap around your neck, tuck and fluff. Tug it low off your shoulders. What size is an oversized blanket scarf? This size is the one I use when I am showing you how to tie the blanket scarf in this video. I love my blanket scarves but with anything they need to be washed from time to time. Be sure to follow all manufacture instructions but here are some simple instructions for acrylic blanket scarves. Spot clean when possible. Hand wash cold, dry flat; or dry clean Do not machine wash, it is better not to wash with colorful clothing. What do you wear with a blanket scarf? Tie the dangling ends together and then pull the loop around your neck in front of the knot. The Simple Slip Knot Double up your scarf and wrap it around the back of your neck. Then, slip both ends of the scarf into the loop. The Half Bow Cinch With the centre of the scarf on the front of your neck, wrap the ends around your neck and back to the front. Tighten and fluff 8. The Knotted Loop Take both ends of the scarf and tie them together. Then open the loop and put it around your neck. This tying method works better with skinny scarves. The Muffler Scarf Take one end of a wide scarf and place it on your shoulder. Take one corner from the other end and make a little knot on one shoulder. Leave the last corner free to give the triangle look. The Knot Row Wrap a thinner scarf around the back of your neck and start making ties. Leave a little space and make more ties. Adjust the scarf so that it looks straight. The Slip Knot Ascot Tie a regular slip knot and then take one end of the scarf and tuck it around and back into the loop. The Double Knot Take each end of the scarf and make a knot. Adjust each end so that they are even with equal lengths extending from the knots. Start twisting the scarf until it curls and then start wrapping the scarf around itself. Fake Knot Tie a loop at one end of your scarf and leave it loose. Slip the other end of the scarf into the loop and tighten it to taste. Double Loop Wrap Start with the middle of your scarf on the back of your neck. Take the second end piece and go under and over the same loop. Knotted Necklace Wrap the scarf behind your neck. Take one end and wrap it around your hand. Pull it through to make a loose knot. Take the other scarf end and pull it through the side knot, going under the knot loop and then over. The Necklace Fold a long scarf if half lengthwise. Grab the diagonal ends and knot them together. Put it over your neck, then twist it and loop again. Double sided twist Put two of your favorite scarves back to back. Loop once around your neck and turn the fabric so that you see both sides. Scarf Wrap The easiest way to wear a scarf! Just wrap it around your shoulders. Cozy neck wrap Take a long scarf and loop it twice around your neck. Tie the ends in a half knot and tuck them up under the scarf loops. Neck Wrap Loop a long scarf once around your neck. Make a half knot with the long ends, up near your neck. Pull the fabric of the neck loop down over the half knot. Knotted Shawl A slightly more advanced version of the wrap. Put the scarf around your shoulders like a shawl and make a half knot in the back with the ends. Pull the ends tight and up high on your back. Pull the scarf fabric down to cover the ends. Classic Loop Put the scarf around your neck and pull one end down slightly longer. Wrap that end around your neck and let both ends hang. Braided Take a long scarf and put it behind your neck. Tie a loose half knot with the ends. Take the right end and cross it over the left then pull it under the scarf loop and over. Let it hang down and grab the left end now on the right side and cross it over the other end and pull it up and over. Repeat until the ends are too short to loop. Pull the braid to loosen it and then knot the short end pieces together. Rolled loop Wrap a scarf once around your neck. Take each scarf end up and over the neck loop. Double Loop Loop the scarf twice around your neck. Take one end over and down through the neck loops and tie ends together. Fold the scarf in half. This is very important if you are cycling or in a convertible. Riding a bike, Vespa, or motorcycle, or driving cabriolet, is a being perfect situation for the summer scarf. This knot adds a clean, put-together element to your ensemble. Drape the scarf around your neck, leaving one end shorter than the other. Wrap the longer end loosely around your neck once, twice if you want a chunkier look or need more bundling. Allowing one end to be slightly longer than the other gives a more natural and spontaneous look, but the length can be adjusted to your preference. The Sophisticate works well with winter outerwear, and is perhaps the best way to wear e. There are two variations: The overall suitability of this style is contingent upon the length of the scarf. If the ends of the scarf extend below the bottom of your jacket, think carefully about whether the ensuing look is appropriate. With topcoats and outerwear, either tuck the scarf inside as in Step 3 or opt for another style of knot. To create The Connoisseur, lay the scarf around your neck such both ends are parallel in the front. Bring one end over and then under the other end. Drape the front end over the back, adjusting the length to your liking. This style may be worn loose and on the outside of your ensemble Step 4 , or slightly snugged-up and tucked into a sports coat or blazer. Because this is a secure knot, The Connoisseur is another appropriate choice for those on the saddle of a two-wheeler or in an open-top vehicle. For classic roadsters, go Connoisseur. Hardtop off the Jeep? The longer end of the scarf is thrown across the front of your neck and hangs over your opposite shoulder. If the scarf is extra long, wrap it around your neck once before placing it behind your shoulder. This is one of the most casual styles, and it successfully communicates activity and mobility. Start with one end in the front, close to your neck, and wrap the long end around your neck until it is short. Tuck both ends into the wrapped scarf. For volume, fluff-out the knot. ## Chapter 7 : 13 Super Stylish Ways to Tie a Scarf | Different Ways of Tying a Scarf

*Scarves are the perfect addition to any outfit. Learn how to tie a scarf 9 different ways to dress up your favorite outfit. I don't know about you, but I long for the fall weather to come.*

**Drape** The Drape leans more towards style rather than function. A scarf drape is best for when the weather is cool, but not cold. The scarf drape works best with a short to regular length scarf. Start by draping the scarf around your neck, making one end longer than the other.

**Over Hand** This scarf knot is very simple to tie, looks clean and functional, and provides good protection to the neck in cool weather. Drape the scarf around your neck, making one end longer than the other. Take the long end of the scarf, cross it over the short end, then bring it under and through the opening near your neck to tie. After you tie the knot, pull on both ends of the scarf to tighten it until you are satisfied with the look. I think this scarf knot looks best when one end is slightly longer than the other.

**Reverse Scarf Drape** This is a great way to wear a scarf in colder weather. Drape the scarf over your neck, making sure both ends are of equal length. Take one end of the scarf and bring it across your neck and over the opposite shoulder, then do the same with the other side.

**Parisian Scarf Knot** A very classy looking way to tie a scarf, this scarf knot provides good warmth to the neck and is a good choice in colder weather. Fold your scarf in half widthwise, then fold in half again lengthwise. Drape the scarf over your neck, and then bring the loose ends through the hole formed by the folded end to tie the knot. Take the long end of the scarf and bring it behind and around itself to form a loop, then take the end down and through the loop. Grab the other end of the scarf and bring it down and through the loop as well to tie the knot. Work the knot up to your neck by gently pulling on each end of the scarf while sliding the knot up. Take the long end of the scarf and loop it once around your neck. Now take the same end and tuck it through the loop you just formed. Grab the other side of the scarf and tuck it through the loop as well to tie the knot. Adjust the scarf if necessary.

**Reverse Drape Cross** Very similar to the Reverse Drape Tuck, this scarf knot works great when you tie it with a longer scarf. Drape the scarf around your neck and make one end longer than the other. Take the long end of the scarf and bring it up and around your neck. Now cross the long end of the scarf over the other end, then bring it up and through the opening you just formed to tie the knot.

**Four In Hand** Another great way to tie a long scarf, this scarf knot protects the neck very well and is the perfect option when the weather is freezing cold. Because of the many folds, this scarf knot is also one of the most intricate looking ways to tie a scarf. Like the Parisian Knot, fold the scarf in half length and width wise, and then drape it over your neck. Take one of the loose ends of the scarf and pull it through the loop formed by the folded end. Twist the loop, then pull the other end of the scarf through the loop to tie the knot. Continue to adjust the knot until the scarf is sitting neatly around your neck.

**Twice Around** This scarf knot is the best choice for freezing weather next to the Four in Hand, but it is much simpler to tie. Again, it will work best if you are using a longer scarf. Drape the scarf over your neck, making one end much longer than the other. Take the long end of the scarf and wrap it around your neck, then repeat again, bringing it around your neck a second time. Adjust the scarf if needed to completely cover your neck, and you are all set for whatever the winter weather has in store for you. Just remember that scarves should be used for function first, and you will be ready to rock this classic piece of menswear.

Pull both of the open ends of the scarf into loop. Adjust the scarf comfortably according to your convenience. Leave the knot loosely or can fit it around the neck. Turtle Neck â€” Tie a Scarf Sprawl the scarf over the neck, with one of its end notably greater than the other scarf. Twirl the scarf around the neck two to three times in the direction. To fix the twirl of the scarf tie a simple knot and tie another overhand knot in order to fix the extra piece of scarf left. Put both of the knots beneath the loop of scarf , so that it look clean and perfectly tied. Waterfall Scarf Knot Twirl the scarf around the neck with one of its end comparably longer than the other. Whorl around the longer end of the scarf only once. Take the end that you looped and sheltered it by the top of scarf. Fit the top corner into the loop. When this is done properly, the unattached side droops down like the waterfall. Fake Knot â€” Tie a Scarf Tie any of the two ends of scarf. Wrap the scarf twice around the neck leaving the knotted end free downwards. Bring the loose end of the scarf through the scarf. Now fit the scarf around neck as per your convenience. Braid Scarf Knot Fold the scarf exactly from the middle. Wear the folded scarf around the neck with the loose ends comparably longer than the folded end. Put the noon folded end into the loop created by the folded end of the scarf leaving behind the space in the loop. Tighten the scarf and fit it according to your convenience. Scarf Wrap We can just simply wrap scarf around shoulders. Tie the both sides into an overhand knot in front of your neck. Ophelia â€” Way to Tie a Scarf Take the scarf and twist, fold in half and drape behind your neck. Pull the scarf through the loop, bring both ends of the scarf through the loops. Skew slightly to the one end, Adjust. Twirl the longer end around your neck and not completely tighten it. Let the twirled end hang down to your back. Pom Pom Scarf knot Place the scarf around your neck, Loop it. Tie a knot on the one end, Tie a knot on the other end, Adjust. Wrap and make a simple loop around your Neck with longer one. Hold your loose end and twist it tightly to the right and then wrap the twisted section around the main loop twice. Repeat it with another side too. Bow Scarf Knot Drape scarf around your neck once and create a full circle loop on one end of the scarf. Pinch the center of the loop and begin wrapping the scarf around the loop from the underneath with the loose end. Continue pulling the loose end around the pinched loop and tie a tight knot in the center. Infinity Scarf Twist Place an infinity scarf around your waist. Twirl the scarf once at your first creating figure 8. Loop around your neck. Boho Loop Tie Find the middle of scarf then place it around the shoulders with the free ends hanged down at the back. Bring back the two hanged ends of scarf to the front but after crossing the both ends. Loosely tie a knot between the two ends and adjust, tighten it to your neck. Cowboy Scarf Fold scarf in half creating a triangle. Wrap scarf from the front leaving the point of the triangle near your navel. Over the top of the triangle, bring the tails of the scarf to the front and tie a square knot letting some scarf billow over the top. Loop and Tuck Scarf Knot Take a scarf and finds its middle and wrap it around your neck with the freely hanged ends at the back. Bring the back ends towards the front. Take the ends of the scarf and twist them around with each other by making it loop. And tighten it until it suits to your neck. Muffler â€” way to tie a Scarf Fold the scarf in such a way it form a square. Fold one end to another in order to form a triangle. Put two ends of triangle over the back of your neck, leaving a point down in the middle. Tie the scarf at the back and adjust accordingly. Scarf Belt Fold on and on the scarf till it gets the desired width. Wrap it around your waist and tie a knot at the back. Knotter Scarf as Shawl Put the scarf around you shoulders with its free ends at the back. Tie a loose knot at the back with the two ends and cover it with scarf. Now adjust the shawl from the front. Knotted Necklace Wrap the scarf behind your neck. Take one end and wrap it around your hand. Pull it through to make a loose knot.

Take the other scarf end and pull it through the side knot, going under the knot loop and then over. Layered Scarf Knot Find the middle of the scarf and drape it around the neck so that free ends hang at the back. Twirl the scarf around the neck and loosen its loop so that it must be comfortable. Cross one end over another and tie a knot. Adjust the loop so that it covers the tail in its front. Cape Wrap Scarf Fold the square scarf to form a triangle. Place the scarf around your shoulders in such away the two edges it comes in front and longest edge comers at the back. Tie the knot between two edges at the front and adjust it. Palm em Neck Knot Fold the square scarf diagonally and let its two ends come at the front. Tie the knot at the front between two ends and adjust it also give it some fluffiness. Tie Scarf as Pretzel Knot Take your scarf and hold one end of the scarf in one hand and one end in the other lengthwise. Now take each end in your hands and put the ends around the back of your neck to form a U-Shape with your scarf. Criss cross the end of the scarf to change the U-Shape into an x shape behind your head. Pull both ends of the scarf down over your shoulders and let them hang. Grab the center of the scarf loop resting over your chest and make one twist so the loop now resembles a figure 8. Then, grab the right end of the scarf and pull it over the lower loop and through the loop. Tighten both ends and adjust as necessary to create a pretzel like formation. This unique way to wear a scarf looks so cute with a jacket or sweater! Half Bow Epaulette Start with a scarf centered around the neck back. Make a loose knot on one side of scarf near your collarbone. Grab the other side in the middle and slide the middle through keyhole, creating a loop. Tighten it according to your convenience. Circle Scarf knot Tie each corner of the scarf to one another. There should be a total of two small knots. Put the scarf on, placing the tied ends at the back of your neck to hide the knots. The scarf should be one big loop. Loop the scarf over your head a second time. Knott Just a Scarf Fold a small square scarf in half along the diagonal and then tie the triangle around your neck. This will create pleats on the outside of the scarf when you wear it. Put it back on over your head and you get a cool pleated look!
