Originally Posted by snakyjake View Post For my question, lets assume both tractors have equal specs, and same price. Is an extra 2" on either side that big of deal? The only concerns I can possibly think of are these: A narrow path, and an extra 4" is too large. The 52" is more difficult to manage. The 52" is too wide and sometimes easy to hit the ground when the tractor is leaning like when going through a rut or slope. You end up hitting the ground more with the 52" than the 48". The 52" bogs down easier when mowing tall, heavy, or wet grass. End up driving the 52" slower than the 48", therefore not really reducing the mow time. Is there something else? My main concern would be hitting the ground with a wider deck. The area I mow is uneven small mounds or small sink holes from being too soggy or the moles hitting the area hard. Sometimes the ground looks even until your tires sink 2" and the mound is 2" higher on the other side. Sometimes around the trees the dirt builds up, and an extra 4" may make it more difficult to ride up to the trees because the tractor ends up leaning. Or sometimes the tractor might lean a bit on some uneven ground, allowing the deck to catch the ground on the low side. What are your reasons for either the 52" or 48"? There are a few locations between landscaping I cannot fit and have to finish by hand but nearby needed additional trimming with either deck and the larger side "wings" can get stuck up on higher ground that the more narrow deck did not. I have not noticed more scalping, though. I do think a shed door or fence gate provides the greatest reason to go smaller. Less than an acre does not matter as much what you get. In real life, many smaller decks have lower HP which can help save gas when using other attachments with your GT NoTime is offline.

This is best played with 4 or more players. Each player gets 6 cards to start with. After each player has 6 cards, take the top card of the remaining deck and flip it up and place it at the bottom so that you all can see it. Closures have the highest power compared to any other suit. All Spades for that match will be considered closures. The King of the closure suit would be considered the strongest card in the deck. Determine the order in which you will play. Closures can beat any other card except for a higher closure. It would be good to save some for emergency use. The Ace of Spades can still beat any other card except for another closure. First player will give a card to the second player. Each one of the cards must be beaten individually by the player that received them. If and only if ALL the cards are beaten then all the involved cards are scrapped and put aside and are considered out of the game. However, if the player cannot beat them, they must pick up ALL the cards. When they pick up the cards, their turn is over and the player after them goes by giving a card to the next player. If the player can beat all the cards, then they can place a card for the next player instead if the next player doing so and the cycle repeats. The card that is first placed down to give to the next player at the beginning of a new cycle is called the initiator card. When a player puts a card down as the initiator card, they can put multiple cards down to give to the next player as long as the cards are the same number suit is irrelevant. P2 must beat them, pass if he has another 6 or pick them up. After the cards are either beaten or picked up, the player who put the first card down must draw until they have 6 cards in their hand. After that, the succeeding players shall do the same unless they have six or more in their hand. When a player is attempting to beat the cards given to them by a previous player, other players can also give him cards to beat as long as the numbers of those cards are on the field. For example, if P2 is trying to beat a 6 of Hearts and a 6 of Clubs and a 6 of Diamonds with a 7 of Hearts and 8 of clubs and a 2 of Spades, all other players can put down a 6, 7, 8, or 2 of any suit for them to beat as well. Note that the 2 of Spades is a closure and can beat any other suit. Since those numbers are on the field, given by P1 and beaten by P2, other players, including P1 can put more cards with the same number down. The number of cards that the player must beat cannot exceed 5. When the player beating the cards have beaten all cards, assuming that there were less than 5 to beat, he must ask if the other players are done placing cards for him to beat. If they say yes, he can then put a card down for the next player. When a player beating the cards use the same number as a card they must beat, they cannot pass it. For example P2 already beat a 6 of Clubs with a 7 of Clubs, but P3 decided to put down a 7 of Hearts for him to beat as well, P2 cannot beat it with a 7 of any suit except for the 7 of closure. It does not pass the cards either. Clubs must beat clubs; Diamonds must beat diamonds; Hearts must beat hearts; Spades must beat Spades. Closures can beat every suit except a higher numbered closure. Players after him does not need to have six cards in their hand as well. The player that puts down all their cards first wins. My friends introduced me to this; hope i got all the rules down. At the starting, the cards are spread evenly among players. Each player has to put one card from the top of his stack to the center of the table. Whoever does this fastest will take the pile and place it at the bottom of his deck. Player who acquires the entire deck wins the game. There are amazing variations of this game like players have to snap their heads before reaching out to pile to add humor and fun. Read how to play snap with killer variations. This game is played with players and cards are dealt to each player. Only the rank matters, suits do not. They will play a card and proclaim the rank but no one is sure they have told the truth. Player has 2 choices. They pass the chance to other player without playing a card. They play the rank but no one is sure that it matches the rank of lead. Go Boom Game This game is ideal for 12 players. Each player is dealt with 7 cards face down and the rest of the cards are stack together forms a pile kept at the center of the table face down. The next player has to play a card of matching suit or rank. Otherwise, he has to draw a card on every turn until the matching card comes up. Player cards are scrutinized after all the players have completed 1 round. Whoever has the highest rank will lead the next round. Animal Game This game is played by young children for fun. Each player has to pick up the name of the animal, the longer the name the better. Each player is dealt with equal cards face down. Each player will play a card face up to the center so that every player is able to see. Player with most cards wins the game. Spoons Game This game is designed for players. Each player must have a spoon. The aim of this game is to collect all 4 cards of same rank. Player who picks up the spoon last would lose the game. Number of players will decide the number of cards. Each player will have 4 cards to commence. All the spoons would be kept at the center of the table within every

players reach. Each player will pick 1 card from his 4 cards and keep them to their left. Player wait till the card from his right is kept on his left. As soon as they pick the card player will match if they have made a pair of four cards. If any player has made a set of four cards, then that player will pick up a spoon quickly. Following him, all other player would try to snatch the spoon as soon as possible. Player who snatches it last would be the loser. There are many variations of this game. The most popular is the pig. Instead of spoons, the player who accumulates for of a kind will place his finger on his nose. The last person to realize this would be loser. It demand basic math, as it requires addition of numbers up to Three or more players can play this game. Each player will be dealt with 3 cards face down and the rest will be kept at center. They are allowed to look at their cards. The aim is to score a total of 31 before the other player. They will pick up a card from the pile while discarding a card from their own hand. Cards from have their face value while face cards have 11 and aces can either have 1 or 11 depending on the variation decided by the player. Chase the Ace Game It is played with a single deck with 3 or more players. Each player is dealt with 1 card exactly. This card should remain face down. Player can look at their cards bit it should not be revealed to other players. The aim is not to have lowest rank. After the dealer has finished dealing, every player has two choices either to pass it to the player to their left or hold that card.

The goal of the game is to collect the most pairs of cards. Shuffle the entire deck of cards and lay them face down. Sometimes it is easier to place them in a square or rectangle layout, but it does not really matter. The youngest player gets to go first and it goes clockwise from that player. A turn begins with a player turning over any two cards. If the two cards match such as two eights of the same color, or two aces of the same color he or she keeps the cards. If the cards do not match, the player is then done with his or her turn. The play moves onto the next player. When a player matches two cards, he or she keeps them and continues on picking two cards at a time until they do not match. Play continues until there are no more cards left face down. The player with the most amount of matches wins. Second places goes to the player with the second most amount of matches, etc. Pin Crazy Eights The object of this game is to get rid of all the cards in your hand. The game can be played with two or more players. Use a standard card deck. Best of luck collecting those crazy eights, they really help you win! Pin Choose a dealer. Once done, the dealer will hand out seven cards to each player if there are four or fewer players, if there are more than four players, each player should start with five cards. The remaining cards are placed face down in the middle of the playing area in a neat stack. Take the first card from the pile facing down and place it face up on the next to the stack. The player sitting to the left of the dealer always begins play and it goes clockwise from here on out. This can be done with either a matching the suit or the rank such as a jack or a nine. If a player cannot match the top card that is laid out on the discard pile by suit or by rank, he or she must draw cards from the stack until he or she can play one that matches the card facing up. If there are no more cards in the draw pile, simply use the ones in the pile you have been stacking up. Shuffle them very well so they are in no particular order. The fun part of the game is that all eights are wild cards. These cards can be played on any card during a turn. When you use an eight, you get to choose the new course of the game, either a suit or rank. To win the game you must empty all the cards in our hand. The game can keep going if you want to let others play until only the last person has cards in his or her hand. Pin Go Fish This is a simple game that can be played with two to ten players. This game also uses a standard card deck. At the beginning of the game, five cards are dealt to each player. If there are four or fewer players, deal out seven cards to each player. The rest of the card deck becomes the fish pond. Sprawl the fish pond out in a messy circle in the middle of everyone. The game begins when the first player asks another player for a card that they have in his or her hand such as a jack or a seven. Players must ask for cards that they have in hand, they are not allowed to ask for a card that they do not possess. If the player that is asked has the card, the player must turn it over to the requester. The player who originally asked the question moves on asking for more of his or her cards until someone tells them to go fish. Go fish is told to a player when he or she asks another player for a card and he or she does not have the card. The player is told to go fish in the fish pond, made up for the extra cards at the beginning of the game laid in a messy circle. The process is repeated over and over again. Once a player has three of one kind such as three 2s or three kings, he or she places them in front of where he or she is sitting for everyone to view. If a player picks up card that is already laid down in front of another player, then simply add it to the pile and pick another card from the fish pond. For example, if you pick up a 3 and the player to the left of you has already laid down three 3s, place your 3 you just picked up in the pile and take another card from the fish pond. The game continues on until there are no cards left in the fish pond and all the cards are laid in piles in front of players. The winning player has the most amounts of sets in front of them. Pin Spoons This game is for three to thirteen players. You will need a spoon for every player. The object of this game is to collect all four cards of the same rank all 2s or jacks or aces, etc. Pin Depending on how many players you have in the game determines how many cards you will play with. If you have three players, then you will separate out three groups of four of the same rank. For example, pull four 2s, 3s, 4s. If you have five

players, pull out five full ranks that will equal 20 cards. Each player will need four cards to begin. Carefully shuffle the cards you are using before dealing. To play the game, each player picks one card from their four and places it face down to the left of them. Then each player simultaneously picks up the card waiting for he or she to the right of them. This play goes on until a player receives four of a rank in his or her hand. The player then quickly snatches up a spoon. All other players want to be observant. Once a spoon has been taken from the center, then all other players want to grab a spoon as well. The last person to take a spoon is the loser. Try and take the spoons in a subtle manner to make it more fun. A variation of the game is done without spoons and is called Pig. Instead of spoons, once a player receives four of a rank, he or she puts a finger on the tip of his or her nose. Pin I Doubt It This is a fun game for three to five players. If there are more players, than use two standard size card decks. The goal is to get rid of all the cards in your hand. Shuffle all the cards together, even if you are playing with two decks. Deal the cards out as evenly as possible. It is okay if some players have more cards than others. The person who has the birthday closest to the current date goes first and then play proceeds clockwise. The first player plays one or more of his or her cards. All cards must be placed face down. He or she must say one, two, three, etc. Even if he or she does not have an ace, the order must start with ace and then descend to king, queen, jack, 10, 9, etc. The next player plays one or more cards from his or her hand, face down, on top of the pile the first player started. Play will go on like this for the entire game, but here is the catch. Obviously people are bluffing. In order to call them out, after a player places his or her cards face down on the discard pile, a player may say "I doubt it. If the cards are not what he or she said they were, he or she must take the entire discard pile. If the cards are what the player said they were, then the person who called "I doubt it" must take the entire pile of discard cards. While numerous people in the game might call "I doubt it," the first person to call it out is responsible for taking the pile if the truth was told. Players must wait until the card s is placed on the discard pile before calling out "I doubt it. Play can continue until only one person has cards left. More fun activities for families.
