The fee requirement is waived for current employees of the New York State Unified Court System and for those who fall into specific categories provided on the exam announcement. Exam Announcement and Filing Period The issuance of an exam announcement and the opening of the filing period usually occur about three to six months prior to the scheduled exam date. The filing period is typically four weeks long. To take an exam, you must submit an application during the filing period. The application must be submitted during the filing period. An email address and credit or debit card are required for successful submission. Separate applications must be submitted for each exam if an applicant is applying to more than one exam. For example, if you are applying to take both the Court Clerk and Senior Court Clerk Exams you must file two applications. An exam announcement may be viewed or downloaded from this website, during the filing period of the exam, until the date of the exam. Seniority Credits for Promotional Exams Promotional exam candidates will have seniority credits added to their score based upon their length of continuous permanent service in the New York State Unified Court System. Seniority credits may not be used to achieve a passing score. Exam History Eligible lists are generally in place for four years and may be extended for one additional year. Consistent with civil service rules, passing candidates will be canvassed in rank order when there is a vacancy to be filled. List Information or Changes to Contact Information Once the list is established and initial results are emailed, Appointments and Systems Management is responsible for the list. The computer-based examination replaces the paper-and-pencil testing process. All applicants must successfully pass the multiple-choice and oral examinations to become eligible to provide court interpreting services for the New York State Unified Court System. Court Interpreter Spanish In order to be employed as a permanent Court Interpreter in Spanish, applicants must pass the open-competitive Civil Service written and oral exams in Spanish and undergo a criminal background investigation. This exam is administered approximately every four years. A fee is associated with the examination and background check. Successful applicants on the open-competitive Civil Service exam are placed on a ranked eligibility list and are also eligible to be placed on the Registry of Per Diem Court Interpreters for Spanish. Anyone wishing to work as either type of judge must have completed a law degree, passed a state assessed bar exam and have obtained a licence to practice law. Despite the similarities between the two roles, there are also substantial differences between these jobs. Becoming a Judge Circuit court judges run for office in state elections. Unlike other elected officials, these law professionals are not affiliated with political parties. Eligibility laws vary between states but in states such as Florida, a candidate must have been practicing law in the state for at least five years before running for office. Associate judges are appointed rather than elected officials. Each circuit court judge has the authority to appoint a sufficient number of associates to handle the case load within the circuit court district. The career longevity of a circuit court judge is determined by the electorate while a single individual can decide to rehire or replace an associate. References 1,2,3 and 4 Term Although associate judges do not have to stand for election, their terms in office are shorter than term times for circuit court judges. Associates serve a four year term while circuit court judges remain in their positions for six years. Both circuit court judges and associates can serve more than one term in office although rules on overall term limits vary between states. Responsibilities Every state is divided into circuits or regions that are based upon population. There are also 12 federal circuit court districts around the nation. Each circuit may elect one or more circuit court judge. Circuit court judges are ultimately responsible for overseeing court cases involving matters ranging from felonies to tax disputes. While a circuit court judge serves one district, an associate can work in more than one county or jurisdiction in which case two or more circuit court judges may have to agree on the appointment. However, while an associate may cover a larger territory than a circuit court judge, associate judges often only handle cases related to one type of legal matter such as child welfare or alimony cases. Wages Responsibility levels have an impact on the wages of a judge. Each circuit elects a chief judge from among the ranks of the circuit court judges and this individual oversees all administrative matters related to trials involving both circuit and county courts. Associates - many of whom specialize in one type of law -are ineligible for this role. Therefore, the narrower job focus of an associate often results in reduced earnings when compared with a circuit court judge. References 5 References 5.
