The season of Christmas is the perfect time to witness and share the Christ story with our pre-believing family and friends because well, there isn't any other reason for Christmas. Here are a number of ways you can engage with your pre-believing family and friends.

Our seasons are finally in sync, at least for a little while. The Advent and Christmas Carols sung once more in church. Even the Christmas inflatables are being filled at some homes, even as you read this. The important thing is we are getting ready. To be sure the world and the church get ready for different reasons. Of course the church gets ready for an entirely different reason. In the season of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus. The actual incarnation of God in human form. While we may prepare for different reason we both come with a sense of expectancy. We know without a doubt Christmas is coming. Why are we so certain? It has always come so why would it not happen this year? We have our own personal experiences with Christmas our memories, our joys and sorrows. We can look back on our life and know whether we were in joy or in unspeakable grief, Christmas still came. And deep down, we just know it. There is a quiet, simple assurance of the Spirit of God that He will come. He and Anna, who will show up a few versus later, are the first Advent celebrants. It has been revealed to Simeon that before he died he would see the Messiah. He lived a life of expectancy that brought Him great joy. How could Simeon be so expectant? First because he was Jewish. Historical events of salvation, or miracles. If God had done so much for them before, why would He abandon them now. Secondly Simeon had his own story. He knew he could look at his own life and see how God had blessed him. If God had never before broken a promise why would He do so now? Thirdly Simeon just knew. He had the witness and the assurance of the Spirit of God resting on His heart. And because he knew, he was expectant. He believed God was about to do something miraculous. Is today the day for the miracle? We talk about miracles all the time. We believe in them. We pray for them. But do we expect them? In this season of expectancy, I want to encourage you to begin to cultivate a heart and spirit that expects God to do something wonderful in your life or in the world. How do we cultivate it? The same way Simeon did. Look at the history of the church. From the Book of Acts until today the history of the church is full of miracles. God is moving, filling changing lives. God would not bring us this far to abandon us. If we have a history of miracles we can expect them today. Look to your own history. No matter how rough anyone has it in life, they can find moments where God made Himself known if they look hard enough. All of us can find moments in our lives where God saved us, changed our hearts, or we witnessed a miracle. If he has done it before, why should we not expect Him to do it again today? Look to your heart. Deep down can you feel the possibility that today might be the day God answers a prayer, brings a miracle? Begin to live a life of expectancy. And what better time to start than at Advent?
