Save Arthur Meier Schlesinger Jr. The son of the influential historian Arthur M. Schlesinger Sr. In particular, his work focused on leaders such as Harry S. Truman, Franklin D. Roosevelt, John F. Kennedy, and Robert F. Kennedy. In the 1950s and presidential campaigns, he was a primary speechwriter and adviser to the Democratic presidential nominee, Adlai Stevenson II. In 1960, Schlesinger actively supported the presidential campaign of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. Schlesinger wrote a popular biography, *Robert Kennedy and His Times*, several years later. He later popularized the term "imperial presidency" during the Nixon administration in his book of the same name. Schlesinger, who was an influential social historian at Ohio State University and Harvard University, where he directed many PhD dissertations in American history. Schlesinger attended the Phillips Exeter Academy, New Hampshire, and received his first degree at the age of 20 from Harvard College, where he graduated summa cum laude. After failing his military medical examination, Schlesinger joined the Office of War Information. From 1945 to 1947, he was an associate professor at Harvard, becoming a full professor in 1948. After President Harry S. Truman announced he would not run for a second full term in the presidential election of 1952, Schlesinger became the primary speechwriter for and an ardent supporter of Governor Adlai E. Stevenson. In the election of 1956, Schlesinger, along with year-old Robert F. Kennedy, supported the nomination of Massachusetts Senator John F. Kennedy. Schlesinger had known John F. Kennedy since attending Harvard and increasingly socialized with Kennedy and his wife Jacqueline in the 1950s. During the campaign of 1960, Schlesinger supported Kennedy, causing much consternation to Stevenson loyalists. At the time, however, Kennedy was an active candidate while Stevenson refused to run unless he was drafted at the convention. After Kennedy won the nomination, Schlesinger helped the campaign as a sometime speechwriter, speaker, and member of the ADA. He also wrote the book *Kennedy or Nixon: Does It Make Any Difference?* Nixon as having "no ideas, only methods. He cares about winning. He worked primarily on Latin American affairs and as a speechwriter during his tenure in the White House. He opposed the plan in a memorandum to the president: It would fix a malevolent image of the new Administration in the minds of millions. He has already launched expeditions against Panama and against the Dominican Republic. One can conceive a black operation in, say, Haiti which might in time lure Castro into sending a few boatloads of men on to a Haitian beach in what could be portrayed as an effort to overthrow the Haitian regime. If only Castro could be induced to commit an offensive act, then the moral issue would be butted, and the anti-US campaign would be hobbled from the start. Following the overt failure of the invasion, Schlesinger later lamented, "In the months after the Bay of Pigs, I bitterly reproached myself for having kept so silent during those crucial discussions in the cabinet room. After President Kennedy was assassinated on November 22, 1963, Schlesinger resigned his position in January 1964. Kennedy in the White House, which won him his second Pulitzer Prize in 1965. After his retirement from teaching in 1967, he remained an active member of the Graduate Center community as an emeritus professor until his death. Ironically, Nixon would become his next-door neighbor in the years following the Watergate scandal. After he retired from teaching, he remained involved in politics for the rest of his life through his books and public speaking tours. He put much blame on the media for not covering a reasoned case against the war.

New Deal Following the Wall Street Crash of and the onset of the Great Depression , Franklin Roosevelt won the presidential election on a promise to give America a "New Deal" to promote national economic recovery. The election also saw a new Democratic majority sweep into both houses of Congress, giving Roosevelt legislative support for his reform platform. Both Roosevelt and the 73rd Congress called for greater governmental involvement in the economy as a way to end the depression. It soon became clear that the overall constitutionality of much of the New Deal legislation, especially that which extended the power of the federal government, would be decided by the Supreme Court. As Interior Secretary Harold Ickes complained, Attorney General Homer Cummings had "simply loaded it [the Justice Department] with political appointees" at a time when it would be responsible for litigating the flood of cases arising from New Deal legal challenges. History of the Supreme Court of the United States and Lochner era Popular understanding of the Hughes Court, which has some scholarly support, has typically cast it as divided between a conservative and liberal faction, with two critical swing votes. Norman (Ed) Epstein This book focuses on an emerging approach to family therapy, the application of cognitive-behavioral principles to the understanding and treatment of family problems.

He made major contributions in the areas of philosophy of religion, and philosophy of science. He taught and conducted research as a professor of philosophy at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, from to , and as a visiting professor at several other universities. His teaching and research interests included philosophy of time, philosophy of logic, and theism. He authored 10 books and more than articles, earned many awards, and gave many presentations as a sought after speaker Schlesinger was also an ordained rabbi, and authored many articles in the area of philosophy of Judaism. He led services, and taught at the University of North Carolina Hillel, as well as yeshivas and synagogues in England, Australia, and Israel. As an author, he has been largely collected by libraries worldwide. At the age of 13 or 14, in , Schlesinger, his brother, and parents were able to obtain a visa and escape to Palestine. Shortly after getting married, Schlesinger and his wife, Shulamith, moved to England. He taught at a Jewish institution in Manchester, England. He went on to receive his B. Sc in Physics at the University of London. Schlesinger and his wife then moved to Australia. After receiving his PhD, from until , he taught at the Australian National University and reached the rank of Reader, equivalent to a full professor. Philosophy professor at University of North Carolina In , Schlesinger moved from Australia to North Carolina, where he began teaching and conducting research as a professor of philosophy at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill. He continued to work at the university until his retirement in During the time he was at the University of North Carolina, he was also a visiting professor many times at the Bar-Ilan University in Israel. He was also a visiting professor at several other universities, including University of Minnesota, the University of Pittsburgh, and the University of Texas. He was particularly interested in confirmation theory, philosophy of physics, and philosophy of time. He taught a course on space and time jointly with physics professor Hendrik van Dam. He and his son David would attend services on Friday night and Saturday, walking in the opposite direction of everyone else going to the football games. Schlesinger also contributed towards books written by others, including Challenge: Philosophy of religion Schlesinger wrote many books and articles in the area of philosophy of religion. He argued very strongly in favor of theism - that there is one and only one infinitely powerful creator of the universe who plays an active role in the world and in our lives. His work focused on examining and analyzing all the arguments in favor and against theism. In his work, many questions are discussed and answered, such as why the world was created in such a way that we have evil and suffering. His work also focused on the logic of belief, including why some would not believe in theism. Schlesinger wrote that there is overwhelming evidence in favor of a creator, such as how fine-tuned the universe is in order to support life. He wrote that although the creator is all powerful, just like it is impossible to name the highest integer, it is not possible to create a world which gives the highest desirable state to its inhabitants. However, those who are dishonest with others, are also dishonest with themselves, and this self-deception leads many to be non-believers and block out any yearning for a higher power. Our entire philosophy of life would derive from this fundamental decision. Schlesinger believed we would be betting our life on whatever we decide. In his article, "The Problem of Evil and the Problem of Injustice," Schlesinger wrote that the problem of why there is evil and suffering in the world vanishes when one considers the characteristics of the world the creator wished to maximize. Schlesinger examined theories as to why there is suffering and then proposed his own theory. He also argued against reincarnation and suffering based on actions in a previous life, as there is no purpose to the punishment if we cannot remember or be aware of our previous lives, if they exist. He proposed his own theory which is that the world was created in order to increase the opportunities for man to do good, which includes a virtuous response to suffering. In this book, Schlesinger presents a strong defense of theism, which includes answering arguments against theism, such as why there is evil and suffering in the world. He

discusses evidence in favor of theism, and why the existence of evil and suffering in the world is not evidence against theism. Schlesinger wrote many articles analyzing and commenting on the dynamic philosophy of time vs the static philosophy of time. Schlesinger described the dynamic philosophy of time as events that move from the future into the NOW, and then further and further away into the past. Although most analytic philosophers support the static philosophy of time, Schlesinger argued in numerous articles that we should not be so quick to abandon the dynamic philosophy of time. Schlesinger offered a Philosophy of Time seminar during the summer of 1970. From this seminar, came the Philosophy of Time Society that continues to exist to this date. The society is affiliated with the American Philosophical Association. He also discusses temporal becoming, the direction of time, and backward causation. He analyzed many interesting questions. In the article "The Credibility of Extraordinary Events", he discussed how believable it is that a rare event occurred when it is reported by a witness with variable trustworthiness. In this book, he applies epistemic logic to "Descartes dream argument, issues of privileged access, fallibilism, scepticism, understanding, confirmation, and the confirmation criterion of meaningfulness". Attitude and how we react, is what determines our happiness and success in life, rather than the actual events in our life. Schlesinger believed that the words we speak are very powerful and we need to be very careful with what we say. In his article, "Silence is a Fence for Reason," Schlesinger offers the advice to "know what we say", but "only say what we know". If we have a high IQ, but let everyone know, then we do not have wisdom[34] Schlesinger believed that good character was very important. He described a self-centered person as one who puts on a jacket when it is cold, rather than building a fire[36] Other Schlesinger wrote articles and books on many other topics.
