**The SUM function** The sum function allows you to add up columns or rows of numbers. The SUM function can be used for columns of data. To sum an entire column or row of data you need to specify the range as column: You can also use your mouse to select specific cells by holding down the CNTRL key and then selecting the individual cells you want to add together. The count function only counts cells containing a number value, not text. The formula to count the number of items in a range would look like this: **The MAX Function** If you want to find the largest number in a range, column or row, then you can use the MAX function to find the largest number quickly. The MAX formula to find the largest number in a range of columns would look like this: To use the SUMIF function, you need to select the range of numbers you want to add together as well as specifying the conditions that must be met.
