Pennsylvania College of Health Sciences students may be eligible for: If a Pell Grant is greater than percent but less than percent, the student may be eligible for a reduced scheduled award. This grant can be awarded for less than 6 credits if the U. Department of Education determines that the student is eligible. Complete the Status Notice form at pheaa. Be enrolled in an approved program of study of at least two academic years. Earn, through classroom instruction, at least 50 percent of the total credit hours required for completing the program of study. Only courses required for the degree can count toward enrollment status of a Pennsylvania State Grant.
