How to draw in black and white using pen, pencil or markers. Shares This may seem like an odd way to start an article on black and white drawings, but when I was a kid, my favourite drawing tool was a blue crayon. These monochrome drawings helped me develop the skills to know how to draw in black and white. However, pens can also be very unforgiving: A big ink blotch could suddenly form and ruin your drawing forever. To prevent this, periodically roll the sides of your pen tip on a scrap sheet of paper to remove ink buildup. Hopefully these next tips will help you get over the learning curve quickly and with ease. Support markers with pencils Sketch with non-permanent pencil before using permanent marker When working with markers, do a rough sketch of your idea in pencil first before making permanent marker pen marks. The great thing about sketching a marker drawing in pencil first is that after the marker ink has dried, you can take an eraser to the entire illustration and remove the initial pencil sketch, leaving the marker intact. Keep your fading markers The unintended benefit of almost-expired markers Because markers use so much ink, they tend to run out quickly. Markers that are running out of ink are great for creating texture or blending together tones. I find them just as necessary in the drawing process as fresh new markers. Harness the versatility of pencils Pencils are versatile for all the different marks they can make Behold the humble pencil: Like handwriting, everybody draws differently from everybody else. Our various styles will inform how we use our pencils so experiment with different types of pencil marks to get the full range of use out of your pencil. This will be valuable especially when using different types of marks to describe textures and elements as completely different things. Keep it light Light sketching helps you explore and refine your drawing When drawing with pencils, we tend to make lines too dark too early. We should sketch with light lines because these only suggest edges and borders; dark lines are for the later stages because they are definitive and not open to interpretation. Lines can darken prematurely if it takes a few tries to get the exact line you want. If that happens, slow down and be more careful; speed up again once you get the hang of it. Use multiple pencils These are my preferred pencils: I prefer to use two or three different pencils, starting with a 2H. Protect your work in progress The low tech way of protecting your work in progress Just like when drawing with ballpoint pen, a blank sheet of scrap paper can come in handy when drawing with pencils too. Pencil drawingsâ€”particularly those done with B pencilsâ€”can smudge very easily so I like to put a blank sheet of paper under the heel of my hand as I draw so as to protect my work in progress. Draw thumbnails first The thumbnail left helps compose my drawing right Before I begin drawing in earnest, I like to first plan out my drawings using small thumbnails. Employing thumbnails also allows me to explore ideas quickly and by sketching small, I force myself to simplify and focus only on the important elements of my drawings.

Sometimes you need to convert an Illustrator file to grayscale. This could be for a print ad, logo option, or even just to try something different. In Illustrator CS3 you have several options to easily change and edit any artwork to grayscale. There are a couple of simple options and a couple of options that give you more control of how the artwork will look. Notes This tutorial was created with Illustrator CS3. Original Below is the original artwork with the four grayscale Illustrator options for comparison. Convert to Grayscale Illustrator This is probably the quickest but least versatile option. Adjust Color Balance With this option, you have more control over the Black. Now you can adjust the Black percentage with the slider. Desaturate If you still want more control over the grayscale Illustrator vector, try the Adjust Color Balance option. Either way, it will bring up the Live Color dialog. At the very bottom of the dialog are sliders. To the right of the sliders are two buttons. Press the button that looks like a play button. Choose Global Adjust from the drop-down list and move the Saturation slider all the way to the left Recolor Artwork If none of the previous options had enough control, you can try the Recolor Artwork option. First, you will need to load the default Print swatches if they are not open. Once these swatches are open, drag the folder of grayscale swatches into your Swatch panel. Now the artwork is grayscale, but the Live Color dialog lets you edit the black swatches assigned to the original colors. Select the original color that you wish to edit from the Current Colors column and use the K black slider at the bottom to edit the black percentage. If you hover over the grayscale swatches in the New column next to the Current Colors on the left, you will see an arrow for a drop-down menu. I like Preserve Tints, but try the others for different results. Ultimately, I liked the Adjust Color Balance option results, but I have used every option for different artwork. If you select an out-of-gamut color, an alert triangle appears in the Color panel or Color Picker. Click the triangle to shift to the closest CMYK equivalent which is displayed in a small box by the triangle. Shift a color to a web-safe color Web-safe colors are the colors used by all browsers, regardless of the platform. Click the cube to shift to the closest web-safe color which is displayed in a small box by the cube. Blending does not affect strokes or unpainted objects. Select three or more filled objects. Do one of the following: Change a color to its inverse or complement Select the color you want to change. In the Color panel, select an option from the panel menu: Invert Changes each component of a color to the opposite value on the color scale. Complement Changes each component of a color to a new value based on the sum of the highest and lowest RGB values in the selected color. Illustrator adds the lowest and highest RGB values of the current color, and then subtracts the value of each component from that number to create new RGB values. For example, suppose you select a color with an RGB value of for red, for green, and 51 for blue. Illustrator adds the high and low 51 values, to end up with a new value To save the tint as a swatch, drag the color to the Swatches panel, or click the New Swatch button in the Swatches panel. The tint is saved with the same name as the base color, but with the tint percentage added to the name. You can use the Color panel to invert individual colors. Adjust color balance of one or more colors Select the objects whose colors you want to adjust. Set the Fill and Stroke options. If you selected any global process colors or spot colors, use the tint slider to adjust the intensity of the colors. Any nonglobal process colors you selected are not affected. If you are working in CMYK color mode and selected nonglobal process colors, use the sliders to adjust the percentages of cyan, magenta, yellow, and black. If you are working in RGB color mode and selected nonglobal process colors, use the sliders to adjust the percentages of red, green, and blue. If you want to convert the colors you selected to grayscale, select Grayscale from the Color Mode list and select the Convert option. Then use the slider to adjust the percentage of black. If you selected any global process or spot colors and you want to convert them to nonglobal process colors, select either CMYK or RGB from the Color Mode list depending on the color mode of the document and select the Convert option. Then use the sliders to adjust the colors. For backward compatibility with previous versions of Illustrator, colors from these libraries also include CMYK definitions. Lab values, when used in conjunction with the correct device profiles, give you the most accurate output across all devices. If color management is critical to your project, Adobe recommends that you display, export, and print spot colors using their Lab values. Choose Spot Colors from the Swatches panel menu. Convert color to grayscale and vice versa Convert colors to grayscale Select the objects whose colors you want to convert. Colorize grayscale or 1-bit images Select the bitmap object. Make sure the Fill button in the Tools panel or Color panel is selected. Use the Color panel to color the image with black, white, a process color, or a spot color. If a grayscale image contains an alpha channel, you cannot colorize the image with a process color. Select a spot color instead. Adjust the saturation of multiple colors Select the objects whose colors you want to adjust. Mix overlapping colors You can use blending modes, the Hard Mix effect, or the Soft Mix effect to mix overlapping colors. Blending modes Provide many options for controlling overlapping colors, and should always be used in place of Hard Mix and Soft Mix for artwork containing spot colors, patterns, gradients, text, or other complex artwork. Hard Mix effect Combines colors by choosing the highest value of each of the color components. Soft Mix effect Makes the underlying colors visible through the overlapping artwork, and then divides the image into its component faces. You specify the percentage of visibility you want in the overlapping colors. You can apply blending modes to individual objects, whereas you must apply the Hard Mix and Soft Mix effects to entire groups or layers. Mix colors using the Hard Mix effect Target the group or layer. Mix colors using the Soft Mix effect Target the group or layer.
