Some of these are the rough draughts, some press copies, some fair ones. In the earlier part of my acting in that office, I took no other note of the passing transactions; but after awhile I saw the importance of doing it in aid of my memory. Very often, therefore, I made memorandums on loose scraps of paper, taken out of my pocket in the moment and laid by to be copied fair at leisure, which, however, they hardly ever were. These scraps, therefore, ragged, rubbed, and scribbled as they were, I had bound with the others by a binder who came into my cabinet, doing it under my own eye, and without the opportunity of reading a single paper. At this day, after the lapse of twenty five years, or more, from their dates, I have given to the whole a calm revisal, when the passions of the time are passed away, and the reasons of the transactions act alone on the judgment. Some of the informations I had recorded are now cut out from the rest, because I have seen that they were incorrect or doubtful, or merely personal or private, with which we have nothing to do. TJ took no steps toward publishing this part of his notes, though his explanation implies that he thought it would be desirable. The following year a second edition published in Boston corrected the grammar of the title, making it *Ana*, but subsequent editors have refused to accept it. In fact, Ford adds a degree of confusion here. There can be no question that these documents were among the three manuscript volumes when he transcribed them. In a description of the papers he had deposited in the Department of State in , Randolph noted: Washington, are bound in three volumes of marbled paper, marked A. They were somewhat successful in the first endeavor and not very successful in the second. Ford included not only manuscripts from the Library of Congress, but also documents from other repositories. Some annotations are included. The commemorative edition presents the same content as the earlier volume edition, but wider margins necessitated two more volumes. The volume Writings is fully available in the Hathi Trust Digital Library; the volume Works is available in Hathi Trust except for volumes 2 and 9, which are search-only. It also contains little to no annotations or other supporting information for the documents. The Lipscomb-Bergh edition has several different imprints, including the Memorial Edition , Library Edition , and the Definitive Edition , These imprints are not known to differ from each other in content. This edition is also well-annotated, including information about extant copies of the documents, their locations, and contextual information that may help the reader better understand the documents. In the early years of its publication, and increasingly as the project progressed, the Princeton edition included long editorial notes accompanying certain documents or groups of documents. These amounted, in many cases, to scholarly essays by Julian Boyd and his staff.
