Both Robert and Cecilia are documented as dying in The vestry book for St. None were found but this is not unexpected as the majority of early colonial records of New Kent were destroyed during the America Revolution. Additionally, since Peter Massie did not immigrate to the American colonies until after the date Cecilia is said to have been born her birth in New Kent, Virginia would seem unlikely. If her birth date is correct, Cecelia Massie can not be a daughter of Peter Massie. The records do not give us an answer but perhaps she is related in some other way. The only other options are that she is being confused with another Cecelia or she is a fabrication. Although it is said that Peter had a daughter named Cecilia she could not have been born in unless the birth date for Peter Massie is much earlier than thought. Questionable Marriage Anderson researchers have indicated that Cecelia Massie is traditionally given as the wife of Robert Anderson but that they have never found anything in the records to support their marriage. Anderson appeared convinced that Cecelia Massie was the wife of Robert Anderson. However this appears to be based only on family traditions as shown by his note 4 on page 1 of his 2nd book. It goes on to say he was a vestryman at St. These are facts that have support in the Vestry records of St. But the next thing we learn is that Robert married Cecelia Massie, dau of "D. Massie and Lucelia Poindexter". The issue with this is that there are no records of a Lucelia Poindexter found, and no marriage records of a D. Massie and a Lucelia Poindexter. The book provides no support but gives the information as a statement of fact. Lucelia Poindexter is sometimes said to have married Peter Massie, sometimes said to have the middle name of David, who is also said to have had a daughter named Cecilia Massie. There again the issue is there is no record of a marriage between Peter Massie and Lucelia Poindexter, said to be the daughter of George Poindexter. In fact, there is no evidence to support Lucelia Poindexters birth to George Poindexter in any record iof colonial Virginia. The Poindexters, including George are conspicuously found in the parish records of St. The Poindexters were prominent in New Kent and did have interminglings with the Massie family which are documented. Noticably absent is any entry for Lucelia. George b is thought to be the only child of Thomas and Elizabeth Poindexter. This would also rule out Lucelia being a sibling. Therefore, George and Susannah could not have had a daughter, Lucelia Poindexter. Her absence in any of the records only supports this conclusion. He and Mary had several children. This Massie daughter was at various times said to be Cecelia, Anne and Caroline. Lets take a closer look at that. Elizabeth

was born , so her mother Cecelia Massie would have been born around 1750. A Cecelia does appear in the parish register, but the register is clear, Cecelia Massie, born 1755 was the daughter of Charles Massie, a son of Peter Massie, and unknown spouse. Whoever the Massie woman is that Richard Clough married could not have been this Cecelia, who was born 5 years after Elizabeth. Perhaps there was an earlier Cecelia? Possible, but the records do not support it. The book has a note about Nathaniel that reads, "Could this name be for Nathaniel Massie, born August 2, 1750, who may have been brother to Cecelia, wife of Robert Anderson, the first. That is a glaring error in that Cecelia has been given at least two birth dates, and 1750, about 5 years before her "brother" Nathaniel and only 6 years after her father, Peter Massie. By my calculations that doesn't add up. Interestingly enough though is that the Cecelia Massie, the one who is found in the parish records of St. Andrew's Church, is, no real surprise here, Nathaniel Massie, born Aug 2, 1750. The answer to that would be, "Impossible". The birth date and birth place given for Cecilia Massie said to have married Robert Anderson seem unlikely or her relationship to Peter Massie is not known. The information contained in her Find A Grave record is questionable because it is not supported by any sources. The preponderance of the evidence makes it clear that Cecelia Massie did not marry Robert Anderson. There are no records that support her marriage to Robert Anderson or her improbable birth to Peter Massie. Historical Note The Anderson family - descendants of Colonel Richard Clough Anderson, a revolutionary officer and surveyor general of the Virginia Military District, was one of the most prominent families of Ohio and Kentucky. Their son, Richard Clough, Jr. He died of yellow fever to Cartagena en route to the Congress of Panama of They had seven sons and five daughters some of whom played an important role in state and national political and cultural life. Larz Anderson committed suicide in June , while visiting his brother Dr. Anderson of Ridgefield, Connecticut. Robert Anderson graduated from West Point in , and was appointed second lieutenant in the 3 rd artillery. He served in the Black Hawk war of as colonel of the Illinois volunteers. In he was instructor of artillery at West Point, and in served in the Florida war, and was brevetted captain. Subsequently, he was attached to the staff of Winfield Scott as assistant adjutant-general, and was promoted to captain in He served in the Mexican War, and was severely wounded at Molino del Rey. In he was appointed major of the 1 st artillery, and on 20 Nov. Owing to threatened assaults, he withdrew his command, on the night of 26 Dec. In recognition of his services, he was appointed brigadier-general in the U. Army and was assigned to the command of the department of Kentucky, and subsequently to that of the Cumberland. He was relieved from the duty due to his failing health, and in October retired from active service. He died in Nice, France in In he was elected to the Ohio senate, where his efforts in behalf of the repeal of the Black Laws made him unpopular with his constituency. He then made a tour in Europe and returning opened his law office in Cincinnati with Rufus King. In he settled in Texas, and at the outbreak of the rebellion was driven out the state for his unionism, and narrowly escaped with his life. He returned to Ohio and was made colonel of the 93th Ohio Volunteer infantry, and was severely wounded at the battle of Stone River. In he was governor of Ohio. He moved from Ohio to Kentucky in and purchased property in Kuttawa, Ky. In October , following death of his father, he returned home and was appointed executor of the estate. For the next three years he was involved in the management of the farm. Having sold the farm, W. Marshall Anderson studied law in the office of his brother Larz in Louisville. In May , he received his law license. Having been stricken with yellow fever, he decided to take a trip West in order to improve his health, and joined the fur-trading party being taken to the Rocky Mountains by the Kentucky-born William L. His health restored, Anderson returned home in the fall of In May , Governor McArthur died leaving a will that resulted in one of the most notorious lawsuits in U. In , Anderson bought a small place near Chillicothe called Glen Mary. In he traveled to Mexico, in order to establish a Confederate colony. William Marshall Anderson died of double pneumonia in Circleville in Marshall Anderson converted to Catholicism in , after years of intense study. He and his brothers were involved in the affairs of the Cincinnati Archdiocese. Marshall Anderson, a zealous Catholic, found himself in confrontation with his sons and sister Louisa, who resented his heavy-handed attempts to interfere with their religious beliefs. Marshall Anderson became interested in archeology and arts, and in June , Anderson was appointed secretary of the American Art Union for the promotion of the Fine Arts in the United States. In , he visited the Lake George area to study mound builders. He succeeded in uncovering a valuable collection of pottery. Marshall Anderson was married twice. He was soon promoted to Captain, and served through the Civil War with the 12 th US infantry, being twice wounded and twice brevetted to Major for conduct in Wilderness and Lieutenant and to Lieutenant Colonel for Spotsylvania Court House. After the war he remained in the Army, rising to Colonel, commanding the 14th Infantry. In , he retired and moved to Circleville, Ohio. The archeological collection was curated by Mrs. In he, in cooperation Robert Spurrier Ellison, Oklahoma oil producer and collector of Western Americana, attempted to publish the Rocky Mountain journals.
