Whatever case, you need to come to the conclusion that there are other ways to capitalize on your pre-made dough than by tossing together a pizza pie. With a few more ingredients – like red pepper flakes or thyme – you could give the rolls a little extra flavor. Preheat oven to degrees Fahrenheit, with rack in lower third. Place 2 tablespoons olive oil in an 8-inch square baking dish. Divide pizza dough into 16 pieces. Form each piece into a tight ball and place in dish, turning to coat with oil. Cover dish with plastic wrap; set aside in a warm, draft-free place until balls double in size, minutes or refrigerate overnight; bring to room temperature and let rise before baking. Season each roll with salt and pepper and bake until golden brown, 35 minutes. Brush rolls with 1 tablespoon oil and let cool slightly. Any topping is fair game, from garlic and Parmesan to a blend of poppy and sesame seeds. You can further customize the crackers by shaping them with cookie cutters. Preheat oven to degrees Fahrenheit. Lightly grease a baking sheet. Cut out shapes with a small biscuit cutter, cookie cutters, or a sharp knife. Transfer to baking sheet. Brush tops with melted butter or beaten egg. Sprinkle with your desired toppings. Bake minutes or until golden brown. Turn oven off and keep them in the warm oven for extra crispness. Store in an airtight container. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper or a silpat. On a lightly floured surface, roll out under your palm into to inch-long ropes. It may take a few minutes to get them that long – roll them out, allow the dough to rest for a few minutes, then repeat until you get to desired length. You can also pick up the dough and roll it between the palms of your hands, working your way down the length of the rope. Form the ropes into pretzels by making a circle with them, then twisting the two ends together and bringing it down onto the bottom of the circle. Place on baking sheet, brush with butter or egg, and sprinkle with salt. Repeat until all the pretzels are made. Bake minutes, depending on their size, until golden brown. They are best eaten warm or within a few hours of baking. If you do not plan on eating the pretzels right away, you can reheat them for minutes in a degree Fahrenheit oven. Brushing the bread with egg white will give the braid a browned, slightly shiny crust.

I will show you how to finish making your roses to decorate your salt dough crafts. These roses could be also used to decorate a photo or mirror frame to match your candle holder. This is the second page in a series of instructions on how to make a roses from salt dough. If you want to start at the beginning go to Salt Dough Decorations. Overlap the last one with the next. You will end up with a longer stalk once you have shaped the flower and added all the petals. Cut off the excess dough. Attach the flower on your dough ornament using a little water and your knife or modelling tool. Check the flower is in the right position. Using a pointed tool carefully make a spiral shape in the central cylinder as shown in the photo. To make a rose bud you will need two balls of dough. One should be slightly larger than the other. Flatten the larger ball of dough to make a long thin rectangle. This will make the petal. Dampen along the edge of the petal. Make a short cylinder from the other ball of dough. Wrap the petal around the cylinder. This time the petal should wrap right around the center and overlap itself. Shape into a rose bud as shown in the photo. Trim the stem to your required length. Place on your dough ornament using a little water. Using a pointed tool make a hole in the center of the cylinder shape. Baking Your Salt Dough Ornaments Bake in the oven at 100°C for around 12 hours or overnight depending on the thickness of the dough. The dough should be completely solid when baked properly. You can test a piece by trying to insert the tip of a safety pin into the bottom of the plaque, if the pin pushes into the dough easily then continue baking. Another test is to gently tap the bottom of the plaque with your finger, it should sound hollow if thoroughly dried. You can use these roses to decorate plaques or bowls as well.
