This causes other students to rebel against the sale, while unbeknownst to them the acting headmaster is counting on the sale to save the school and his own reputation. Characters Jerry Renault represents very accurately who I was when I was his age – Jerry was just starting to come into his sexuality, and I was just starting to understand mine at that point.
