Especially scientific subjects such as biology, chemistry and physics will have difficult exams in the first year of studies which introduce a certain barrier. Students have to create their own timetables following the curriculum they choose. The universities provide options to combine studies and follow individually adjusted curricula, but the organisation is obliged to the student and administration involved is high. Private universities have existed since but are considered easier than public Universities and thus hold less esteem. Most universities are public and run by the state. Only those who fail multiple classes in a year, and have to retake them, pay a partial or full tuition fee. Almost all universities are public and are held in higher esteem than their private counterparts. Attending university is free in Denmark. All universities are public and free of charge. But many private institutions such as the Catholic University of Lyon , use "university" as their marketing name. Most higher education institutions are public and operated by the states and all professors are public servants. In general, public universities are held in higher esteem than their private counterparts. From through , public universities were free of tuition fees; since then, however, some states have adopted low tuition fees. All universities are public and enjoy de jure institutional autonomy, although in practice this autonomy is limited by ministerial interventions in issues such as student enrolment, academic recruitment and funding. With the exception of the Hellenic Open University , undergraduate programmes are offered tuition-free for Greek citizens, as are many post-graduate courses. Education is regarded as a constitutional responsibility of the state and the establishment of private universities is prohibited by the constitution. Almost all the universities are public, but they enjoy de jure institutional autonomy limited by the state in practice, like in Greece. A few scholarships, both at undergraduate and postgraduate level, are also available for the best low-income students. Private funding, even for research, ranges from low to non-existent, compared to most other European countries. Almost all universities are public and are largely funded by the Ministry of Education. The fee was set at 1, euros in These fees range between approximately 7, for relatively cheap bachelor programs and 30, euros for master programs in medicine a year. All universities are supervised by the Ministry of Education, even the private ones. Almost all universities are public and state funded. Universities are divided into a few categories; private universities which are operated by private citizens, societies or companies, and public universities created by Acts of Parliament. The Government pays all tuition fees, and other costs of students. Most private universities charge tuition fees directly to students, and these institutions are generally held in lower regard than public universities. There are 13 public universities , a university institute and a distance university. Higher education

in Portugal provided by state-run institutions is not free, as a tuition fee must be paid, although being much lower than the tuition fees of the private ones. The public universities include some of the most selective and demanding higher learning institutions in the country, noted for high competitiveness and nationwide reputation. There are a total of 74 universities. Most of them 52 , including the most prestigious ones, are public, and are funded by the autonomous community in which they are based. As such, university funding may differ though not significantly depending on which Spanish region the university is based on. However, the central government establishes by law homogeneous tuition fees for all public universities, and as such university fees are much lower than those of their private counterparts. The highest tuition fee allowed by law was, as of , of Public universities are state-owned but granted a considerable degree of independence when it comes to self-government; they cannot, however, make free use of their assets i. In turn, public university administrators, lecturers and professors are granted civil servant status, which serves as a tenure because only under exceptional and very well justified circumstances can a civil servant lose his job under Spanish law. Research funding can be allocated either by the autonomous community or by the central government; in the former case, funding amount and conditions vary greatly from one autonomous community to another. Most universities are public. Education in Sweden is normally free, so there are no tuition fees at any university in Sweden. Surging demand for higher education ought to have given Kenya a good reason to clean up its universities. But as the number of private and public universities has grown over the past seven years, from 17 to 24 private and five to seven public institutions, so have concerns over the quality of learning. The increase in the number of students seeking university education has not been matched with a similar expansion of facilities, watering down quality, a problem made worse by inadequate number of lecturers. Employers are now raising concerns that while the country has been releasing a growing number of graduates onto the market - estimated at more than 10, annually - most lack the much-needed technical skills the economy needs. Higher Education Minister Margaret Kamar said last month that the mushrooming of higher education institutions had compromised standards and there was a need to clean up the system. It is hoped that the inspection will also accurately establish staffing levels in universities, and whether a shortage of tutors continues to hurt learning. Although the number of qualified lecturers has been growing, it lags far behind the student enrolment rate. This has meant that universities have recruited non-PhD holders, with many people holding only a masters degree taking up teaching jobs. The lecturers lobby group, the University Academic Staff Union, says there are at least 9, lecturers in public and private universities in Kenya. The number stood at 7, five years ago, meaning that only 2, lecturers have been added to the system during this period. As the country improved access to primary and secondary education, by making primary school free in and subsidising secondary schooling from , the number of students seeking university education has soared. The country has been gradually rolling out a series of reforms to revamp its higher education system under the National Strategy for University Education, to be implemented by It will see the creation of new campuses in rural areas and funding upped to enable more students to enrol in the coming years, easing the pressure that has been piling up on existing universities. Administrators in public universities have been laying blame on the government for the growing challenges in the higher education sector, saying they have resulted from funding not matching the student growth. This has undermined university expansion plans, including the construction of new campuses. Kenya has upped direct funding to public universities, from Sh Today Kenya has seven public universities, 13 recently-established constituent colleges attached to the state universities, and 24 private universities, according to the regulatory Commission for Higher Education. Some experts had suggested that expansion of the 13 constituent colleges, established two years ago, could help deal with the admissions backlog in public universities. But the colleges seem not to be doing the trick. They are also grappling with inadequate facilities, making them ineffective in meeting their goal of improving access. The new strategy will see universities, all of which are currently clustered in urban areas, spread their wings into more rural areas and offer locally appropriate courses such as dry-land farming, tourism and hospitality, marine sciences and environmental resources. The country has been scouting for options to help it admit at least 40, more students to universities to help end a backlog of learners which has built up over the last two decades. It had hoped that private institutions would help to expand places, but talks between them and the government shuddered to a halt earlier this year over issues of funding. In a bid to further expand facilities and opportunities, Kenya has lined up two new specialised universities. It has made the same amount available to the Pan-African University, which is expected to go live next year. In recent months, the Commission for Higher Education CHE has been raising concerns over the problems facing the sector. It has said that many courses in which thousands of students are enrolled have not been accredited and can therefore not be recognised as offering proper qualification, putting thousands of careers on the line. A similar fate has befallen law graduates from some public and private universities after the Council of Legal Education rejected their qualifications. These moves by professional bodies, along with the rapid increase in the number of institutions, added to the pressure on government to act on higher education quality. Minister Kamar said in her announcement last month that the CHE had been directed to revisit and re-inspect the

quality of programmes offered at all registered private universities, colleges and other tertiary institutions. Public universities were exempted, with the government apparently satisfied that existing processes were sufficient to ensure standards. Kamar said some institutions had failed to delivery the quality of services promised when they were registered by the commission.
