

Chapter 1 : Merit Badge worksheets - MeritBadgeDotOrg

The program uses a series of medals and patches as emblems. The badge for the Scout rank consists of a simple fleur-de-lis, which symbolizes a compass needle. The needle points the Scout in the right direction, which is onward and upward. The stars symbolize truth and knowledge; the eagle and shield symbolize freedom and readiness to defend it. The knot reminds each Scout to remember the Scout slogan, Do a Good Turn Daily, and the upturned ends of the scroll symbolize cheerfulness in service. Star has a First Class symbol on a five-pointed yellow star, and initially indicated the five merit badges required to earn the rank. Life has a First Class emblem on a red heart, and initially symbolized the first-aid and health-related merit badges that the rank required. The current design for the Eagle Scout badge was adopted in 1908, with minor modifications in 1911 and 1925. The Eagle Scout medal is of the same basic design as in 1908, with only occasional slight modifications due to changes in manufacturer over time, most recently in 1971. The current design of the other rank badges were finalized in 1925. These badges were available during only. Scout[ edit ] Scout was previously a joining badge, but is now considered the first rank, and is earned by completing certain requirements. As of January 1971, the Scout badge has a gold fleur-de-lis on a tan background. The badge is awarded when the boy demonstrates a rudimentary knowledge of the Scouting ideals such as tying a square knot and knowing the Scout oath, law, motto, and slogan. A Scout can work on the requirements for the Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks at the same time, but each rank must be earned in sequence. The badge is awarded when the Scout completes requirements in the areas of Scoutcraft, physical fitness, citizenship, personal growth, and Scout Spirit. The badge is similar to that of the Scout rank with it adding an eagle and two stars [2] Second Class[ edit ] Second Class is the rank above Tenderfoot and below First Class. A Scout can work on the requirements for the Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks at the same time, but must be earned in sequence. The badge is awarded when the Scout completes requirements in the areas of Scoutcraft, physical fitness, citizenship, personal growth and Scout Spirit. At this point, Scouts stop focusing on the Scout skills, and start working on leadership. Later ranks were originally recognitions of earning merit badges beyond First Class, and not properly ranks. Now these additional ranks form a second tier where Scouts can further develop leadership skills and explore potential vocations and avocations through the merit badge program. Although Eagle is the highest rank and one all Scouts should strive for, the number of Scouts achieving First Class within one year of joining is still one of the key measures of unit effectiveness. Studies [14] purportedly have shown that if a Scout achieves First Class within a year of joining, he typically stays in the Scout program for at least three years. Scouts who do so are purportedly more likely to retain Scout values as an adult and achieve the BSA primary mission of "producing useful citizens". After 1971, this was replaced with a series of requirements to demonstrate awareness of advanced first aid techniques, including CPR. A sixth merit badge was added to the requirement for Star rank at that time to maintain its overall requirement of 21 merit badges, and First Aid is still one of the merit badges that is mandatory for Eagle Scout. It is the third-highest rank. Star is awarded when the Scout serves actively in the troop, team or crew in a position of responsibility for at least 4 months; performs at least six hours of community service; and earns six merit badges four of which must be among the 13 required for Eagle Scout rank. Initially, the Life badge was awarded for five merit badges and the Star badge was awarded for ten. The order was reversed in the 1970s when it was decided that the five-pointed star of Star Scout better represented the five merit badges required for first rank above First Class. That symbolism disappeared when the number of merit badges required for Star was increased to six in 1971. Life[ edit ] Life is the second-highest rank attainable, above Star and below Eagle. Life is awarded when the Scout serves actively in the troop, team or crew, serves in a position of responsibility for six months, and performs six hours of community service. Finally, the Scout must pass a Scoutmaster conference, and board of review. Life was originally lower than Star, and originally

required earning five specific merit badges concerned with health and fitness First Aid, Lifesaving, Public Health, Personal Health and Athletics. The ranks were switched in the s, following a decision to recognize the five-pointed star as a symbol of the five badges needed to earn that rank. The Life heart came to symbolize achievement in health and fitness, as the First Aid merit badge was required for both Life and Eagle until , when it became required for all ranks above First Class. Since its introduction in , the Eagle Scout rank has been earned by more than two million young men. This includes an extensive service project that the Scout plans, organizes, leads, and manages.

In the BSA, Scouting is considered to be one movement with four main programs: Cub Scouting is available to boys and girls from kindergarten through fifth grade. They will be subject to the same membership and rank requirements as their male counterparts. Both boys and girls will be part of the same program, and both will be eligible for all of the same awards, up to and including the rank of Eagle Scout. Girls will join all-girl troops. Boys will continue to join all-boy troops. Scouts BSA will not have any mixed-gender, or coed, troops. Anyone certified as disabled "may enroll in Scouting and remain in its program beyond the regulation age limits. This provision allows all members to advance in Scouting as far as they wish. Other programs[ edit ] The Boy Scouts of America offers several other programs and subprograms beyond the traditional membership: The Order of the Arrow is the Boy Scouting national honor society for experienced campers, based on American Indian traditions and is dedicated to the ideals of brotherhood and cheerful service. It is earned by living your life by the Scout Law. It utilizes programs designed for schools and community-based organizations that are designed to prepare youth for the complexities of contemporary society and to enhance their self-confidence, motivation, and self-esteem. All Learning for Life programs are open to youth and adults without restriction based on gender, residence, sexual orientation, or other considerations other than age requirements. Until recently, girls were not allowed to join Cub Scouting or Boy Scouting, but could join Venturing and Sea Scouting; women can be adult volunteers in all programs. On October 11, , the BSA announced that girls would be allowed to become Cub Scouts, starting in , and that in , a separate program for older girls will be available, enabling girls to earn the rank of Eagle Scout. It is a common belief that the BSA does prohibit members who are atheist and agnostic based on its "duty to God" principle and that members adult and youth agree with the Declaration of Religious Principle in the bylaws. The MOU also specifically includes within Unitarian Universalist chartered troops Humanism as an acceptable form of spirituality as well as Earth-centered religions. Dale that Boy Scouts, and all similar private voluntary organizations, have the constitutionally protected right under the First Amendment of freedom of association to set membership standards. The resolution went into effect on January 1, , [60] [61] but Scout leaders who were "open and avowed homosexuals" were still prohibited. Some churches and conservative members threatened to quit the Boy Scouts in response. Local chartering organizations are still permitted to set their own standards based on religious principle for selecting the adult volunteers for their unit. The announcement included the statement that girls in Cub Scouting will simply be called "Cub Scouts" but that a name would need to be given to the new Boy Scout equivalent program for girls that will launch in February ; the name will be "Scouts BSA".
