In Driven you say: How have you failed? And how did you get up afterwards? So a guy Twittered back: I have been knocked down so many times into the dirt, that taste will never leave my mouth. I have failed a million times, and I will fail many more. I picked up the phone. I called the receptionist, and I got a meeting. Why is picking up the phone so hard for some people? And so our CFO is trying to collect that money. I mean some people do but they are a small percent. Most people will avoid conflict at all costs. Picking up the phone and calling somebody might get you something good, but it might also get you rejection. And fear by far is a greater motivator. I think we only do 20 percent of stuff in life for pleasure. I think most of the things we do, we do to avoid fear. How do you get over the fear? The Story of Success] â€” 10, hours makes an expert. Two is you have to disassociate your ego from the rejection. It happens to me today. I come out with a book and people Twitter. I love social media, people are so honest. So a hundred people Twitter me how much they love the book. One guy Twitters that the book is a piece of crap and he hates it. Do I read the 99? You have to learn to disassociate that. Throughout Driven you mention that the perfect pitch has to be made in 90 seconds or less. People make pitches for everything everyday â€” asking for a raise, asking for a discount, negotiating a better rate on a mortgage. What can a pitcher do to succeed in so little time? You have to project an aura of humble arrogance. But in not such a way where you say: Your kids are growing up in a very different environment than you. How do you raise kids to be driven? I just think fundamentally it comes to your environment. I mean my kids are probably spoiled more than the average, but they are very clear in life that everything has a give and take. Do you feel you need to top or exceed your past success? And a lot of people I meet confuse that with, should I always want more money? If you did five things, do seven. I ran a marathon last year, I was thrilled that I ran the marathon. I never thought I could do it. I crossed the finish line in a lot of pain. Did you ever imagine your life being the way it is now? I always say that if I could have imagined what I know now, I would have been much more successful. As I get older I try to think ten years from now, how will it look? I asked that same question to my wife the other day, and I said: Are you ever frugal? Very VERY long pause. When we were young we never had any money, everything we bought was to the penny. So if we went on vacation it was always the cheapest place we could find. If we were buying a car, it was the cheapest car we could afford. I think that for me it [frugality] was associated with something negative. I understand that everything has a cost. I go to the cash register to pay for it â€” I have no idea what it costs. I take it back. It offended my sense of sensibility. Even for me, I was like: I try four other suits, and I hate to admit it â€” nothing fit as well. It still bothers me. Looking at your life today, what would you say to your younger self? I would say to myself: For my own well-being I had to become rich. I think when I was a little kid I had a lot of doubt, a lot of fear, and a lot of second guessing. I find out news on Twitter now before I do in the media. We had an Earthquake in Toronto this summer. And sure enough right there I see an earthquake. Typically PR or
