Do their little bird-brains recognize chimneys on sight and understand what they are? Do they follow the lead of local birds that may be returning to a chimney where they spent the summer? Of those that descend toward the chimney, you can see that about half seem to veer away at the last minute, while hundreds of others continue to circle noisily overhead as the sky darkens. Because the thousands of birds in the chimney are still trying to find parking places? One minute and 34 seconds long. You know the drill: The show is over. We thank our host and start to shuffle out to the elevator. I ask Dean Ewing how many birds he counted this evening. He tells me that he ended up with a total of 15,, the largest Chimney Swift roost ever recorded in Alachua County. We were guests of David Holbrook this evening. He invited us to come back in a week to enjoy the spectacle again, but I have a feeling that the birds may have migrated south by that time. In and the latest date on which swifts were seen in Alachua County was November 3rd, and our latest sighting in the last fifteen years was November 5th. Nothing but a few swifts seen this morning but zip tonight. I think that they have headed to other places.
