In the early s Eaton had toured Europe to study civil service reform, and in the late s, at the request of President Rutherford B. Hayes, he revisited England to make a formal report on its merit system. The assassination of President James Garfield in by a disappointed office seeker gave impetus to the reform movement, which culminated in the passage of the Pendleton Civil Service Act of Arthur appointed Eaton chairman of the three-man Civil Service Commission established under the new law, a post he held until his resignation in Renewing his interest in city government, Eaton wrote *The Government of Municipalities* , one of the first such studies. He died on Dec. In his will he endowed chairs at Columbia and Harvard universities to continue the study of national and municipal government.
