Bible publishing is actually a pretty fascinating thing when you start digging in to things like paper choices, binding materials, etc. The best book on earth should be put in a format that lasts, as its words will outlast us. This Bible was a gift from my wife that I received in The short of it is that this is the most durable, well-made Bible I own. After two solid years of preaching, teaching, classroom work, carrying it in a bag, study, etc. It is very thin leather, and feels very stiff€not much different than bonded leather, a combination of mostly plastic and leather. It has softened and become fairly limp compliant anyway with use. Mine has recently started feeling like real leather. From what I have read, the higher-end Holman Christian Standard Bibles in cowhide find them here are about the best covers you can find in this price range. I have not actually seen this Bible in person but have read a review of it at www. I do mostly no-podium, no-notes preaching, and this Bible suits me just fine. This is about as thick as you can go for this kind of preaching, in my opinion. One important feature of this Bible is that the pages are Smyth sewn to the binding, rather than glued. Most glued text blocks still have that sewn-looking cloth bit coming out the top and the bottom, so even if your Bible has that it still may be glued. This one is sewn, and the flexibility shows it. Where this Bible might lack in cover material, it makes up for in paper quality. That also increases legibility, and it a mark of a more high-end Bible. My only real complaint has to do with the font size, but more on that later because that ties in with the addition of the Ministry Resource Guide, a section at the back of the book along with the concordance and maps. The Ministry Resource guide is nearly identical between these Bibles, so I would be interested to know the story behind these from two different publishers. All that aside, you do not have to be a pastor to benefit from this resource guide. As you can see from the table of contents, there are a number of other issues covered in the guide that any Christian can benefit from, such as the section on dealing with grief and stress personally and helping others with that. There is also a section on tough questions about God regarding evolution and creation, suffering, assurance of salvation, and others. I actually did buy one of these for a friend of mine recently who graduated Bible college. As a side note, this Bible was advertised as having two ribbon markers, although mine came with only one. I added the two ribbons you see in the photos. Hendrickson makes a good Bible. Solid, long-lasting, even if there are aesthetic preference differences I may have. This Bible also comes in black, and the burgundy is currently out of stock nearly everywhere.
