In he was ordained a Catholic priest for the Diocese of St. He earned the degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology from St. During this period he was invited to work as a research fellow at the American Schools of Oriental Research in Jerusalem , where he worked on a concordance of the Dead Sea Scrolls. In he served as a peritus expert adviser to the Bishop of St. Hurley , at the Second Vatican Council. The Archbishop of Los Angeles , Cardinal Roger Mahony , hailed him as "the most distinguished and renowned Catholic biblical scholar to emerge in this country ever" and his death, the cardinal said, was "a great loss to the Church. Past statements are not rejected but are requoted with praise and then reinterpreted at the same time. What was really going on was an attempt gracefully to retain what was salvageable from the past and to move in a new direction at the same time. Brown identified three layers of text in John: Literary critic Frank Kermode , in his review of *The Birth of the Messiah*, accused Brown of being too eager to secure the imprimatur of the Catholic Church. Brown did much to define the term *sensus plenior* and had an enormous influence on the twentieth-century debate concerning the term.
