Soaring is by definition gliding high, and anyone who has ever seen eagles know they do so with spectacular ease. Perhaps this is why God chose them as our model. Aerodynamics of Soaring To soar, an eagle needs a headwind, but since this seems opposite of what they should need, I asked my pilot husband to explain. He said that eagles must face into the wind to experience lift. The air currents flow over and under their uniquely formed wings, creating an air pressure difference. As the higher pressure below tries to equalize the lower above, the gliding bird is lifted up. Gradually, though, the eagle will lose altitude, forcing it to land, if not for the added boost of rising air currents, such as warm air and updrafts, or increased wind. When assisted by these air currents or winds, a gliding eagle can then soar. He wants us to soar spiritually in our daily walk with Him. They will soar high on wings like eagles.
