When she sees Ramirez with another woman at the club, her suspicions are confirmed. And it turns out Ramirez was with an informant who gets scared when Maddie enters the scene and takes Maddie as a hostage to escape from the club. Yeah, she is really crazy. And that celebrity turns out to be none other than Mia who plays the lead character Ashley in Magnolia Lane. She has been receiving death threats through fan-mail and she was really worried about it. Maddie decides that the best way to make it up to Ramirez would be by helping him solve this case. So, although he had warned her to stay away from the sets, Dana and Maddie land themselves jobs at the Magnolia Lane sets. And on the very second day of their job, there is a death. Apparently, the target was Mia but Veronica, the stand-in for Mia, else was killed. Everyone thought that the killer might have mistaken Veronica for Mia. Thus, the investigations begin. Jasmine has now become a millionaire thanks to her online pornography business. She learns that Veronica has been working for Jasmine and that she was on some shady business on the sets. Maddie is convinced that the criminal is someone from the staff itself, because there is noway that others could gain access to the sets. Thus she goes on investigating, questioning and snooping around the cast of the Magnolia Lane. And Mia, thanks to her starry tantrums, has enough people who hated her and want her away for good. Also, someone has been following Maddie too. And no, this time it is not Felix, the reporter. Someone with evil intentions. Her place gets ransacked, she gets chased and her jeep gets hit while she was in it. She also gets couriers threatening to kill her. With the turn of events, she hatches a plan to nail the criminal. But, before she could see anyone, suddenly the criminal has Maddie by the throat who is left gasping for breath and struggling for survival. Who has been sending death-threats to Mia? Who was the killer? Answers to these and some more of such questions forms the rest of the story. The most annoying aspect of this novel has to be the re-introduction of all the characters. All the characters from the very first novel are again introduced. Most of the introductions were not needed or at least Gemma should have changed the style of introduction. The writing is terribly trite. Most of the actions, talks, words, reactions are repeated time and again in the novel. And most were repeated in the first two installments too, annoying the readers some more. The dumb blonde is no longer funny. In one scene, where a homicide cop is questioning Maddie about her relationship with the victim, Maddie goes on blabbering incoherently looking at Ramirez and counter-questions every question posed by the cop, to annoy the cop and the readers alike. While the best thing about the series was humor and the first two installments scored heavily on that, this book totally fails at that. In fact, the novel seems uninteresting until the second murder takes place. It seems that Gemma is just prolonging the novel, just like she did the other two, for the heck of it, and it takes way too much time for the actual plot to settle in. *While 'Spying in High Heels' introduced me to the intoxication, 'Killer in High Heels' turned me into an addict, and now, having done with 'Undercover in High Heels', the third book in the series, I find it difficult not to consider myself as a fanatic reader of this series.*

This is an independent story, with enough background information about the heroine, her friends, and her family inserted to make the reader understand the relationships. When choosing to review this book, I hoped for a fun read with a mixture of mystery and chick lit, two genres I usually enjoy. I ended up seriously disappointed, mostly due to a narrator-heroine I hated so much that in the showdown I caught myself hoping the villain would finish her off and thus end the book—and my suffering. Alas, with a first-person narrator, no such luck. In a fit of jealousy, Maddie follows him there, spots him with an attractive brunette, and creates a scene. The situation gets worse as the brunette whips out a gun, takes Maddie hostage, and shoots at some cars on the parking lot outside. Ramirez then tells Maddie that the brunette was an important informant, and that he has been demoted to bodyguard duty as a result of Maddie spoiling his case. His new job is to guard the life of a soap star who has been receiving threatening letters. To make it up to him, Maddie decides on the spot “against his express orders” to join the set. She and her best friend Dana manage to obtain positions as a wardrobe assistant and an extra respectively, and go detecting. What follows is a short satire on life at the set of a soap. Several eccentric minor characters help her with her quest, the most interesting being Felix, a British tabloid reporter, but again Gemma Halliday does not develop much further what might have been a strong supporting character. Maddie is the kind of heroine who constantly gets into trouble. She is ditzy, never thinks before she acts, and often takes risks in a truly TSTL manner. If that alone were not off-putting enough, I found her truly disagreeable because she is entirely without moral scruples. She spends the greater part of the novel running from her boyfriend, not answering his calls, and in fact shows far greater loyalty to her best woman-friend, and I wondered what made him put up with it. She exploits her friends without once considering their feelings, obviously thinking her asking prettily will make anything okay. What was, like, charming in *Clueless*, does so not work here for me. Geez, do year-old women in L. And if they do, um, do I want to read about it? So, with a truly obnoxious heroine and quite a lot of wasted potential, *Undercover in High Heels* is a novel to give a miss. Buy *Undercover in High Heels*:
